My astonishment is great indeed,
in seeing the prodigious difference
between the case announced & the
one received. $rv^*U \pm 4 Dmf$ not appear to
me the original case from Melbourne
but only a part of it.

The advertisement in Bulletin de la
Société Botanique de France & your own
letter of 22nd February 1868 offer
for sale a large case of 10 cubic feet,
while the one I received only measures
as follows: length 2 feet (64 centimetres),
width 1 foot (36 centim.), height $\frac{2}{3}$ of a foot (20 cm).
It consequently contains $2 \times 1 \times \frac{2}{3} = \frac{4}{3}$ or 1 cubic
foot & $\frac{1}{3}$, which is $\frac{1}{10} = \frac{4}{30} = \frac{2}{15}$ or less than
the seventh part of the quantity announced
or moreover the case is not quite full.

I am so anxious of proving to you

the uprightness of my character & the veracity
of my objections, that I have requested
the British Consul here to ascertain the
accuracy of my measures, & I send you
herewith his certificate.

Now, whenever we consider the
"V^A4**" of a mass of loose plants without
names it strikes every one that it
consists in the quantity or consequently
that $\frac{1}{7}$ of the bulk announced cannot
be worth more than $\frac{1}{7}$ of the price.

Concerning the Algae from M^r. Spruce,
the species of which are rather poor &
without names, I find the prices very high,
particularly for the freshwater species.

Allow me to say again, I am greatly
disappointed at the size of a case out of
which I expected the many thousands of
specimens of Algae announced & which
would have stocked my herbarium &
supplied exchanges with my friends. However,
I wish to act fairly, & if you agree, as
I think it but right, to the reductions in
the proportion suggested for the Australian Algoe,
I will take your price for those of M^r. Spruce.

I beg you will give me an answer
as soon as possible. **rr-A** a friend of mine
^?*&z James Lloyd, a fellow countryman
of yours, who has many years experience
£^£&^4t^, of those of our shores,

that the preparations of your Australia's
algae should no longer be put off/
~~without~~ loss of their colour and value.

Many thanks, Sir, for your

me regret that Dr. MacCoy's algae
have not been the object of a similar
attentive study.



excessive demand from many botanists, and a few months ago

In your "Lichen-flor" I see *Pyrenopezia*

and I never saw that species ^{^A-r-*} such a station.
I first detected it at more than one mile from the seashore,
and it was in that locality that ^{A.} A. L. Bolbotrichus
during his visit to my country seat at Greville-House,
where I had the pleasure to entertain him, and guide him
also to the maritime rocks of Greville and there let him
make a copious provision of some other lichens that
I discovered, such as *Figariadum laevium*, *Lecidea lewightii*,
and also *Chedrela petraea*, *Opegrapha granulosa* etc.,
which were then unknown to him and which he
afterwards found in the Channel Islands, as I hear now
from you "Lichen-flor":

As to *Berweraria mucosa*, I have seen that species,
(or at least what Nylander named so, and I have no
foreign species), not on maritime rocks, but only in
fresh water, on pebbles at the bottom of small rapid-

riplets, where I made a collection of a score
of specimens. That young gentleman had promised
to procure me some British lichens, but never
gave me any notice of his time-his visit, and
I am quite ignorant where he lives.

Would you be so kind as to grant me some
British Lichens, I shall be most happy and grateful
for such a precious gift.

I have joined to my parcel a few exotic lichens
which were brought to me by some friends of the way;
if there may be amongst them something interesting
for you, I shall be very glad of it.



Otherwise, I really could not think

of accepting your kind offer of

Duplicates. I have collected lichens
in two or three other parts of France,
besides this, and may perhaps, in the

you. There are, on the other hand,



In reply to your query, I beg to say.

1. That the Church of the Primitive Age knew
of no posture more standing for the Priest when
communicating himself. This appears (a) from the Rubrics of the Liturgy of S. James,

2. It is the present use of the Eastern Church, &

4. The Rubrics of the C.P.B. make direct the Priest
to kneel at Communion. The word of the Rubric will dictate
