Department: Botanical Survey of India

1. Important policy decisions taken, major achievements during the month:

Scientists of BSI reported three new species of plants viz. Bambusa daoporijeana (Poaceae), Henckelia dasii and Henckelia Iallanii (Gesneriaceae) from the Eastern Himalayan state of Arunachal Pradesh, India. Scientists of BSI conducted 5 field / local tours and collected 246 field numbers of plants. Besides, they also completed metadata of 710 herbarium specimens.

- BSI organized its 10th RAMC (Research Advisory & Monitory Committee) at BGIR, Noida from 20th to 21st September, 2021, under the chairmanship of Prof. A.K. Koul. Shri Ravi Agrawal, the Addl. Secretary, and Smt. Manju Pandey, Joint Secretary, MoEF&CC inaugurated the RAMC meeting.
- BSI and its regional centres organized Hindi Fortnight from 01.09.2021 to 15.09.2021 and Hindi Diwas on 14.09.2021. On this occasion, various Hindi competitions were organized to promote the uses of Hindi in official communications.
- BSI, ANRC, Port Blair organized a lecture on the topic 'Handloom: An India Legacy.' as a part of celebration of 7th National Handloom Day-2021 on 07.09.2021.
- BSI, SHRC, Gangtok organized a webinar on the auspicious occasion of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' and released the book "Wild Balsams of Darjeeling & Sikkim Himalaya" among International Audience via online mode on 07.09.2021. Dr. A.A. Mao, Director BSI released the book.
- BSI, AJCB Indian Botanic Garden, Howrah, in collaboration with the Regional Outreach Bureau, Kolkata (Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Govt. of India) organized a 5 days photo exhibition for the general public from 29th September, 2021.
